NVIS is the most efficient form of communication in a mountainous area short of line-of-site. The range is 2-600 miles depending on ionospheric conditions. NVIS net -- WARTS 6pm 3.975

Lowering your NVIS antenna will reduce your noise floor, and placing parallel wires in the ground will increase gain 5-6dB

SWR isn't everything – a resonant antenna might not be 50ohm impedance.

S9/DX Engineering, etc 31' and 43' verticals good for DX. Radials – more =better, AM broadcast use at least 120
