Fred is now in charge to obtain the trophy. Charlie reported on the WWARA repeater directory. Club members would have access to the on-line site if the club paid our dues to the WWARA organization. The club approved this expenditure. Dave reported on the battery backup project for APRS. The \$20 limit was exceeded, final cost was \$22.64.

New business: David introduced David Friedman, KE7GOY. David F. works for the ARC and asked our club if we would consider teaching another Tech. Class. David has several groups that are interested. One such group the Pasado's Animal Rescue Organization of Monroe could provide a class location. David said they could have around 40 students and the ARC has 20-30 folks interested. Dave mentioned that the Element 2 has changed and we would need to replan our lessons. The club authorized the purchase of an instructor's guide and textbook for element 2. A class would start no earlier than February, instructors will need to meet and plan with the new materials. Also mentioned is that the "Micro-Hams" from Microsoft have a power-point program for element 2. John will check into this for the club. David stated he would be available to the club to make a presentation about the American Red Cross, ARC. Dan has volunteered to give a lecture about high voltage safety. The club will need to provide a laptop computer and projector for this lecture.
